How can I use conditional formatting in Excel to highlight duplicate entries?

- 1. Select the cells you want Excel to review for duplicates.
- 2. Go to the Home tab Styles section. Click "Conditional Formatting" and choose "Highlight Cell Rules", and then choose "Duplicate Values."
